Materials

It is recommended that you bring the following materials to class every day including: **pencil, pen, a spiral notebook, colored pencils (box of 50), and a place in your binder for class materials.** Please see me if you are unable to obtain any of the recommended materials.

Daily Routines

- Class will begin when the bell rings.
- Write down the agenda and homework when you take your seat in class.
- Silently begin the warm-up.
- Please remember that the bell does not dismiss you, **I do!**

Class Rules

- Ms. Yates' Golden Rule: **Respect**- yourself, your teacher, each other, your school.
- Be prepared, seated, and ready to work when the bell rings.
- Drinking of water only is permitted in class. There is no eating allowed in class.
- During instruction you must raise your hand to speak in class.
- Cell phones: no headphones, no charging of phones, no texting, and no phone calls are permitted in class. Cell phones and headphones are to be put away during class unless you are specifically instructed to use them for a class activity. Absolutely no pictures, video or audio recording is permitted in the classroom at any time unless explicit permission is given to the student. Taking of pictures, video, or audio recording in the classroom will result in immediate confiscation of a student's cell phone.
- Bathroom use: Students will receive 3 bathroom passes for the semester. I will document use of these passes on a class roster. If a student does not use their passes, they can be redeemed for extra credit points at the end of the semester. Students will use the sign-out sheet and a bathroom pass when they leave class for the bathroom.
- Clean up your area before leaving each day.

Consequences

1. Warning
2. Four Questions/Behavior Check
3. Lunch detention/Call Home
4. Behave Out/Class Suspension- referral to assistant principal

If a student is caught using their cell phone or any electronic device during class time without permission, the phone will be placed in the "cell jail" by the student where it will remain until the dismissal bell rings. A third offense will result in the cell phone or device being confiscated and turned in to the assistant principal. Any other item deemed to be a distraction (make-up, toys, etc.) will also be handled in the same manner.

Any refusal to follow the teacher's instructions or class policies will result in an automatic class suspension.

Homework

- Homework is due at the beginning of class. If it is not turned in at the beginning of class, it is late.
- It is better to turn in assignments late than not at all. Late work will receive partial credit. Any late work will be accepted at 10% deduction per day.
- It is **your** responsibility to make sure that you get any missed homework assignments or that you schedule any make-up tests.
